Source of the name "Corona Virus"

The name "coronavirus" is a reminiscence of solar corona and coined by [Jules A. Almeida](#) and [David Tyrrell](#) who first observed and studied human coronavirus. The term "corona" is derived from Latin *corona*, meaning "crown" or "wreath". They have characteristic club-shaped *spikes* that project from their surface, which in [electron micrographs](#) create an image reminiscent of the [solar corona](#), from which their name derives.
